COURSE OBJECTIVES/ BRIEF COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course explores legal and equitable remedies in the area of private law, focusing on torts, property and contract law. Emphasis will be on principles relating to remedial selection and creative ways for meeting clients' needs. The major educational goals for this course include:

- Explore the method of remedial choice, emphasizing factors that influence various choices.
- Explore principles governing the assessment of damages and the rationale – What is actually included in a particular remedy and why.
- Consider public policy considerations that influence courts' choice of remedies, including social justice concerns.

EXPECTED EVALUATION METHODOLOGY (SUBJECT TO CHANGE)

1. Mid-term examination: 40%
