Lectures, class discussions, demonstrations and class exercises. The course will consist of a series of mock trial exercises including witness examinations, opening and closing arguments. A full mock trial will be conducted at the end of term.

Students are required to attend all classes and be prepared to participate in all assigned and spontaneous exercises.
